sheet be accepted. Carried.

Special Meeting held at King of

A special Meeting was held at the King of
Denmark on Saturday 13th March 1920. to consider
the question of finance. After a lengthy discussion
it was proposed by Mr Cornford, seconded by Mr
Stazell. that 1/6 per annum should be the
minimum sum paid by any member, before

An Amendment was proposed by Mr. Wightman
& seconded by Mr. Hoole that the amount be 2/-
Further discussion followed and Mr. Cornford
& Mr. Stazell agreed to withdraw their proposal
in favour of the amendment, the latter was
carried unanimously.

Proposed by Mr. Wightman Seconded by Mr.
Hoole that the Entrance fee be increased to 5/-
An amendment was proposed by Mr. Hoole
seconded by Mr. Waghorn that the fee remain
at 3/6. Upon a vote being taken the
Proposition was carried.

Mr Stazell proposed & Mr Sturdy seconded that
all seats be booked. Carried
